



Being a good citizen!

Narrator: Today I want to remind you that this rule that we all have to stay at home is temporary. Temporary means that this is not going to be forever. We will be able to come back to school at some point!

Narrator: Do you know that at our school we teach everyone to be a good citizen? This means that we need to be nice, helpful, encouraging and supportive to our families, friends, neighbors and community.

Narrator: Today we are going to practice being a good citizen. There is a preschool near my home where the children began coloring pictures of rainbows to remind everyone, including adults that there is hope. This will get better. We have to practice hope. Somebody came up with the idea to tape a rainbow to front doors or windows in their houses so people could be reminded that we are all in this together and to keep the hope alive.

Narrator: Attached, is a rainbow. Please color the rainbow and tape it to your door or window so your neighbors can see. If you would like to practice being a good citizen, you could color a rainbow, write the word hope on the paper and either give it to a neighbor or tape it to their door. There is no right or wrong way to color this rainbow. Your creativity is what makes it special!

Narrator: Send your teacher a picture of the rainbow hung up at your home or your neighbor's home.
